Student Free Days-Term 3

In Term 3 we will have two Student Free Days for staff professional development. We have committed to implementing the MACS Intervention Framework and we will require two days as well as staff meetings to learn about all aspects of the framework. The Intervention Framework promotes academic and behaviour success for students through the systematic implementation of early identification, strategic support and scaffolded learning. It is premised on the belief that this can be best realised when school staff work collaboratively in a team-based approach. Throughout our learning we will be supported by Marina Juka and Fiona Hannagan from MACS. The dates are; Friday 2 August and Monday 2 September. TeamKids have been advised and will be available on these days.

Holy Rosary Science Fair 2024

Our annual Holy Rosary Science Fair will be held on Friday 17 May from 3.15 - 5.30pm in the hall. Students will be presenting their projects to their classes this week and the teachers will judge students' ability to articulate knowledge of the scientific concepts involved, the quality of their projects, and their ability to answer questions on their topic.

Year 3/4 Camp Reminders

Our Year 3/4 camp is fast approaching and we can feel the excitement in the air! We have included links to two articles that may be helpful, particularly if this is the first time your child will be away from home. One of the suggestions is to have a few sleepovers so they get used to sleeping away from home. A social story will be shared to your child's school email address which will include photos of the camp. The social story can provide an opportunity to discuss camp with your child, the things they may be excited about and any concerns they may have. You may want to tell them that camp is a great place to try new things. The social story will also include details of the activities and a list of items that they need to bring. You will receive a hard copy of this list as well as a medical form. The medical form needs to be returned to school by Friday 17th May.

In the next week, you will also receive an email asking about your child's dietary requirements. This is not about your child's likes and dislikes. It is about allergies and intolerances. To reassure you, the camp does not have your email address. The school has put this in through the MyCYC. The camp will not use this information (or any other information that you share) for any purpose not directly related to camp. Wellbeing

At Holy Rosary School all children and families are expected to be Wellbeing Warriors who look after the safety and wellbeing of themselves and others

Following on from last week's information about resilience, here is an information sheet that is useful when determining what skills your child already has and skills they may need to improve. Have a read through the list. You might also like to tick off what your child is already doing and then think about developing some of the other skills.

Creating resilient kids together

It's important for your child to learn the personal and social skills that will help them to become more resilient and cope with problems and difficult situations that may come their way.

Check the skills your child already uses and those that they need to learn.



Self-awareness skills

- Be able to identify their strengths and challenges.
- Be able to know what might influence their successes and mistakes.
- Be able to see that the way they think about mistakes and negative situations can affect how they feel and behave.
- □ Be able to self-reflect on their behaviour and decisions.
 □ Be able to accept that setbacks and problems are a normal part of everyday life, and know that these situations often don't last and will improve with time and effort.

Self-management skills

- Be able to manage strong feelings such as fear and anger, and turn these feelings into better ones.
- Manage impulses that may present a risk to their safety and wellbeing.
- Be able to make plans.
- Be organised, self-disciplined and courageous to achieve their goals.
- □ Be able to predict problems and solve problems.
- ☐ Have an age-appropriate level of independence.
- Be able to focus on the positive things in negative situations.
- Use thinking that is grounded in fact and reality.
- Find something funny in a setback or problem to help keep things in perspective.

Social awareness skills


- Be able to read, predict and respond empathically to others' feelings and needs.
- Appreciate others' points of view.
- □ Not exclude others because of their differences.
- Know where to go to ask for help at home, at school and in the community.
- □ Believe that relationships matter.

Social management skills

- ☐ Have the skills to make and keep friends.
- Be able to sort out conflict and cooperate with friends and peers.
- Be able to make decisions based on safety and respect for self and others.
- ☐ Be able to ask for help when required.

Book of the Week

Hatchet by Gary Paulsen is a novel for older primary school aged students. This story tells of a boy who survives a plane crash on his way to find his father, after his parents divorce. The boy, Brian, adapts and develops survival skills that help him to hunt, build shelter and survive out in the wild alone, while he waits to be reduced. This is a great story for older students about the ability to adapt and deal with challenges that life throws our way.



Holy Rosary Positive Behaviour for Learning

Every child has the right to learn and every teacher has the right to teach.

Congratulations to the PBL winners from last week: Jasmine (Prep) Zara (Yr 3) and Lucas (Yr 5)

Lesson Plan: I can wear my uniform correctly.

Step 1: List Learning Intentions and Success Criteria

We are learning to: wear our uniform correctly.

It will look like: Students wearing their full academic uniform on the non sport school days and wearing their full sport uniform on allocated PE and sport days.

Step 2: List a rationale for teaching the behaviour Why is it important?

Holy Rosary School Values: Relationships, Respect, Resilience, Integrity, Kindness (highlight relevant values)

Holy Rosary School Expectations: Safety is our right. Learning is our responsibility. Respect is our way. (highlight expectation)

Wearing our school uniform identifies us as members of Holy Rosary School. When we wear our uniform correctly we show pride in our school, and our appearance, and we ensure our safety.



Year 1/2 Learning

Literacy


In Literacy, we have been pulling apart the text '<u>Journey of the Sea Turtle'</u>. We followed the life cycle of a loggerhead sea turtle and discovered the impact that humans can have on this process. We have started using this book as a means to discover new vocabulary which can help uplevel our writing.



Last week, we made a book about our mums for Mother's Day, which was a perfect time to learn about similes! We spent time discussing the purpose of a simile and finding some examples of them before applying them to our mums. In case you are wondering, among other things, our mums are:


- As clever as a computer

Mathematics

In Mathematics, we have been exploring shapes. We started by making all sorts of complicated shapes before realising that simple shapes can come in all different forms so we challenged ourselves to find them all. This included the different types of triangle (equilateral, Isosceles, right and scalene) and quadrilateral (square, rectangle, rhombus, parallelogram, trapezium, kite, dart and irregular). We have been describing shapes using mathematical language such as corner, angle, side, length and opposite.



Inquiry

In Inquiry, we have been focusing on the concept of change in our environment. We have been introduced to the concepts of reducing, reusing and recycling and how they apply to the waste we produce.

We also attended the webinar 'Ollie Online' where we learnt about Screen Time vs Green Time.

Screen Time is time spent on devices, such as iPads, phones, game consoles and computers.

Green Time is time spent doing activities that don't require devices, such as reading, drawing, writing, playing board games, going outside, and many other activities.

It is important to balance our Screen Time and Green Time, especially before bed so that we can be the best learners we can be, and remember: "One hour before dream time, finish up your screen time!"

Religious Education

In Religious Education, we have been learning about the Creation story. We began by looking at a set of stained glass windows from St Monica's Cathedral in Cairns that depicts this story before hearing different Bible versions. In the coming weeks we will listen to Aboriginal creation stories and compare these to find similarities and differences.


