Our school wide focus on Positive Behaviour for Learning has had a significant impact on our learning environment. Students know our school expectations around safety, learning and respect. Fabulous new posters have been placed around our school to reiterate our expectations. They look wonderful. We thank Michaela for coordinating this job, and Kendra for her talents and expertise in this area.

Dog Safety

We have some concerns around the safety of our students with dogs. We have had the <u>Responsible Pet</u> <u>Ownership Program</u> at school every year since 2017 (excluding Covid years) to help spread the message about safety with dogs. Initially, we allowed dogs on school grounds but given some children's fear of dogs and the risk of allergic reactions to dog saliva, we moved to a dog free yard. Unfortunately, this has resulted in a number of dogs gathered near the entrance of the school. As there have been some recent experiences of children approaching dogs and even being nipped by them, we ask that you;

1. wait away from the immediate gate area. For example, the church is a less congested space.

2. reinforce the message of the Responsible Pet Program by ensuring children do not pat your dog without asking your permission, and ensuring that they pat the dog from the side, rather than face on.

We ask for your support as a way of ensuring the safety of our children.

Learning from around the classrooms. This week we feature 3/4.

Religious Education

In Religious Education lessons, students will delve into the rich tapestry of faith, exploring rituals, symbols, and celebrations that define our beliefs. They learn the significance of sacraments like the First Eucharist, embracing traditions that deepen their spiritual connection. Through engaging lessons and reflective practices, students will gain a profound understanding of Catholic teachings, preparing them for a life of faith and service.

<u>English</u>

This term the 3/4 students will be studying the book <u>'The Little Wave</u>'. The book focuses on the themes of friendship, new experiences and staying true to yourself. We will use the text to deepen comprehension strategies such as predicting, connecting and summarising.

We will explore the author, <u>Pip Harry</u>, and the techniques they use as a writer. The students will utilise these techniques to create engaging, hybrid texts. We will focus on strengthening proofreading and editing skills for accurate spelling, grammar, punctuation, and sentence structure, through targeted exercises and constructive feedback.

<u>Assembly</u>


Year 3/4 Sky presented an engaging assembly last Monday, based around our current Inquiry unit on endangered animals and sustainability. Sharing their experiences from their trip to the Melbourne Zoo, they emphasised the importance of caring for our planet and its inhabitants. From learning about Clean Up Australia Day to discussing the impact of plastic waste on the environment, the students encouraged everyone to take action. Through pledges to reduce, reuse, recycle, and protect natural habitats, they inspired a collective commitment to sustainability.











Mathematics

This term students will dive into the fascinating world of number in mathematics, mastering multiplication and division through a variety of strategies. Students will learn diverse strategies, both mental and written, to tackle mathematical challenges with confidence. Engaging in activities and practical applications will ensure a deep understanding of these foundational concepts, empowering students for future challenges.

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Inquiry

In our latest school excursion to the Zoo, students embarked on a captivating journey into the world of wildlife conservation. Exploring the habitats of endangered species, they gained firsthand insights into sustainability and the importance of protecting animal populations. This immersive experience enriched their understanding of environmental stewardship and biodiversity conservation. Throughout the term we will continue to explore endangered species and we find out how we can act and protect them. We hope to showcase students' findings later in the term.











Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Holy Rosary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- · a modern user-friendly interface
- · rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 6 September 2024.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

Resilience

This week we are taking a break from the <u>MHiPS</u> project to discuss resilience. Over the last couple of weeks we have noticed an increased number of students needing support to overcome problems. Problems that students should have the skills to manage themselves or are no longer age appropriate. As a result, over the next few weeks, teachers will be talking explicitly about resilience and providing students with opportunities to develop the skills they need, in order to be resilient.

So what do we mean by resilience? Resilience is the ability to cope with life's challenges and bounce back from adversity. We naturally encounter ups and downs in life, and we need certain skills to be able to deal with the downs. These skills include managing emotions, problem solving, optimism and the ability to set and achieve goals as well as characteristics such as good self-efficacy, flexibility, humour and determination, among others. Although some of these skills and characteristics develop with age, there are things that you can do at home to help your child develop these further, see below;

- Support your child but don't solve every problem for them
- Acknowledge your child's feelings but don't dwell on them, start thinking about possible solutions
- Offer praise when your child does things independently
- Give approval and encouragement for trying new things and for having a go
- Avoid predicting and preventing problems for your child
- Keep things in perspective and maintain a hopeful outlook
- Accept change and model adaptability in your own response to changes
- Give your child responsibilities at home

In this story, we follow Emmi, a young girl who is learning about being resilient. This story models resilience, persistence, and the ability to face challenges with tenacity. Children who are resilient are brave, curious, confident and problem solvers. 
